
Thank You!

the wisdom of these two great



Connect the Drops: Faith Science & Youth Leadership

Galilee is located in the Capitol Region Watershed District. Our Watershed is a large area of land that includes Lake McCarrons, Lake Como, Crosby Lake, a long swath the Mississippi River, and a plethora of rain gardens, streams, ponds and creeks. God has gifted us with a beautiful watershed for us to live in, work in, worship and play in, and also take care of!

We have the awesome responsibility of being stewards of this creation of God. "Connect the Drops" is the curriculum for our Confirmation students this spring, as well as the theme for our Wednesday night soup suppers this Lent. Each Wednesday night we will hear a scripture reading about WATER and then listen to a message about how we can impact our watershed. The watershed is important because it has to do with how all of the water that falls from the sky, as rain and snow, is then soaked into the ground, and how it flows into the lakes and streams and all ends up eventually in the Mississippi River. The Capital Region Watershed District is partnering up with churches like Galilee

to help us do something to make this water as clean and pure as possible before it flows on to the rivers, lakes and streams. Our Galilee youth will be the leaders in creating a project, such as making a rain garden, or adopting a storm drain, or making part of our church lawn have some prairie grass, or plant new trees. We will see what they come up with!



In the meantime, we will "connect the drops" - drops of ideas, of scripture, of science, of good ideas to see how we can pay attention to our precious watershed.

By the way, she is currently serving her second threeyear term on the Galilee council, so she must have learned to endure meetings over the years. At first, she just started helping Louie in the garden, bringing a truckload of hostas from Highland Park and many other plants from friends and relatives. She expected they would just do the front, but Louie wanted to do the area by the upper entrance. Now, of course, Louie is gone, so Darla is plugging away on her own. She would love getting some partners in the garden and hopes her niece Mia can help out.

Darla has a huge family, many who came to the funeral of her nephew Beaver at Galilee recently. Galilee has been her church for over 19 years now and she loves the church and all the people inside.

She worked for the St. Paul school system for 28 years in a special education program at Bridgeview for some of the most severely handicapped children in the schools. She is happily retired now living with her partner, of almost 40 years, Kevin. LaParis is her beautiful adopted child who is doing very well now, having graduated from college and working as a dental hygienist. Many at Galilee remember her as a confirmation student with a big, warm heart.

The message she would like to leave for Galilee members is, "Come and weed with me. It's wonderful, calming, and peaceful. When the church bells ring, I always think about Louie."

ELCA Hunger Grant Recipients The Saint Paul Area Synod is pleased to announce that one of Galilee's ministries has been awarded a ELCA World Hunger domestic grant in 2020: "Galilee's Rice Street Gardens brings together gardeners to grow healthy food to feed their families and friends. The gardens are a community partnership involving Galilee Lutheran Church, with support from St. Paul Regional Water Services (which leases more than two acres with the approval of the Maplewood City Council), McCarron's Pub & Grill (which allows use of their well water), as well as many other organizations. The site has 266 plots and is the second largest community garden in Minnesota. Over the years, there have been gardeners from at least a dozen countries. Besides providing a place for people to grow their own food and share in community-building relationships, Rice Street Gardens also partners with organizations to provide services for health and education, such as English tutoring, vision screening and basic health screening. Galilee shares its worship space with Minnesota Faith Chinese Lutheran Church, St. Paul Friends Nepali Church, International Christian Faith Center (West African) and La Hermosa (Spanish speaking); members of these faith communities share responsibilities such as mowing and turning compost. The ELCA Hunger Grant will be put toward hiring an administrator and language interpreters, as well as expanding the garden to 300 plots."
